## 2. TO APPROVE AND SIGN MINUTES OF MEETING DATED March 16<sup>th</sup> 2015.

The minutes were taken as read, agreed as a true record and signed by the Chairman.

## 3. MATTERS ARISING FROM PREVIOUS MINUTES (information only)

Item 5.2 Conifers planted in the highway verge believed to be associated with planning application F/YR14/0390/F. The Clerk had received a response from Fenland District Council (FDC) stating that as the conifers were outside the area covered by the planning application it was not possible for them to take action, and considered it a highways matter. The Clerk had copied the response to Cambridgeshire County Council highways, no response had been received to date. The Clerk was asked to remind highways and request a response.

## 6. CORRESPONDENCE RECEIVED

- (a) FDC Notice of Election. **Noted.** The Chairman congratulated those who had been elected unopposed.
  - (b) FDC Adoption of Developer Contributions Supplementary Planning Document (SPD). Noted
  - (c) CAPALC Training Courses 2015. Noted
- (d) Sayers Crescent. The Chairman explained the situation in that there was great concern regarding the appearance of some properties. He was aware that the Housing Association had planned to visit the properties but was not aware if this had taken place. Cllr Broker explained that there had been a change of staff at the Housing association and records lost so that the monitoring process had had to be restarted. He was not aware that there had been any contact from Cambridge Housing Association. The Police had been involved. Cllr Knight stated that the Housing Association had a responsibility to clear the rubbish away and keep the site in a respectable condition. Cllr G Booth added that the issue had already been reported to the Safer Fenland Team. The Clerk was asked to write to the Housing Association expressing the Councils concern and requesting a solution to the problem, with a copy to FDC.

#### 7. HIGHWAYS MATTERS

Highways and street lighting matters.

(a) Meeting 12 February 2015 with Amanda Hill, Local Highway Officer, Cambridgeshire County Council.

The Clerk confirmed that he had thanked Amanda Hill for attending the meeting and for the repairs that she had arranged. The Clerk was asked to contact Amanda and request action to those defects that had not been attended to, in particular the safety issue at Gull Drove due to overgrowing vegetation.

(b) Bellamy Bridge meeting. This project was nor with the Highway Engineers to develop options.

Highways and streetlight reports from Councillors on problems causing immediate concerns.

(c) Highways

Tholomas Drove loop road – concern that the verge was badly churned up.

Cllr Fish – A47 Guyhirn roundabout – surface was deteriorating badly with loose material causing a skid hazard.

Cllr Allen – T junction at Guyhirn breaking up with numerous potholes 60mm deep.

B Britain – noted new larger signs at the A47 Left Turn Only. Subsidence at The Gull due to main sewer trench settlement.

D Broker – Cants Drove highway issues – The development has permission and operations are in accordance with the approval.

Cllr Knight enquired if there had been any progress in resolving the surface water flooding at Wisbech St Mary bungalows. Cllr Britain replied that he had reported back to North Level IDB and it was with the Engineer to write to the owners to ascertain their response before taking the matter to the Board, possibly in June.

Plash Drove trees dead branches in danger of falling. The Chairman commented that this
had been an issue since 2007 and wad considered a significant threat. Highways had
been advised but no action had resulted as yet.

Cllr Jennings – issues as previously raised and reported to CCC Highways.

Cllr Barnes - issues as previously raised and reported to CCC Highways.

(d) Streetlights.

Cllr Fish reported that Balfour Beatty had visited Thorney Toll to clean and repair 21 lights.

Cllr Barnes – street light at the Pigeons not working and no number.

#### 8. FINANCE MATTERS

(a) To receive the final budgetary control report for 2014/15. The Clerk confirmed that the anomaly reported in October had been identified as an unpresented cheque from 2013/14 and the figures adjusted accordingly. The 2014/15 balance recorded was £ 144,851.01. **Noted** 

(b) To receive a budgetary control report for 2015/16 to date. The Balance recorded was £174,280.03. **Noted** 

The Chairman thanked the Clerk for all the work he had put in in preparing the accounts.

(c) Corporate Governance Questionnaire (CGQ) for signature by the Chairman. The Chairman drew attention to the contents of the CGQ as circulated and recommended that accounts be initialled by a councillor or all councillors at least once during the year. **All agreed and the Chairman signed the CGQ.** 

(d) Approval of the 2014/15 Accounts as they stand prior to internal Audit. Agreed

## 9. PARISH PROPERTY

- (a) Parish Notice Boards. Cllr. B Britain said the cabinet maker had commenced work and they were likely to start being erected within a month.
- (b) Bus Shelter Maintenance. The Chairman reported that S Bowles had been cleaning shelters. It was clear that some of the shelters required additional cleansing visits.

Cllr Broker said that costings were not yet available for the steel design option.

Cllr Knight commented that the existing shelters were poor and not fit for purpose. He would like to see improvements with new shelters with seat/perch.

## 10. REPORTS FROM DISTRICT AND COUNTY COUNCILLORS

Cllr Broker: FDC had adopted the Developer Contributions Supplementary Planning Document having given consideration to the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL). They had decided not to adopt CIL but to keep the section 106 process. Cllr Booth had made the point at FDC that the document was not clear in that some sections were vague. If CIL was adopted the Parish Council would get 25% of CIL funding if a Neighbourhood Plan was in place, 15% it was not. Cllr Booth:

- Cambridgeshire Community Volunteer Service were promoting opportunities for funding with Heritage Lottery Fund in attendance. The Chairman added that Cambridgeshire ACRE were also promoting help within the community. Cllr Booth said that ACRE has Leader II funding so any organisation looking for funding should get in touch.
- Wryde Croft Wind Farm funding, £55k per year, would not be available until operational at the end of the year. They are likely to invite a representative of the Parish Council to attend a meeting in due course.

Cllr Gillick: had met with various officers at CCC and had been told that the Cants Drove operation would be putting in place lay-bys to ease the passing issue and would fill potholes. He had also

discussed traffic management options for Murrow and Guyhirn with Emma Murden although funding would be an issue.

#### 11. POLICE MATTERS

None received.

It was noted by the Chairman that 4 PCSO's had attended the school at Wisbech St Mary to tackle the parking problem.

## 12. ANY OTHER BUSINESS (for information only)

(a) Cllr Knight complemented the Parson Drove litter pickers (Street Pride Group). He said that this had been impressive and should be considered. It had taken him 12 minutes to report a litter problen to FDC. Apparently 400 callers had abandoned calls which could not be good.

Cllr Britain noted that the service at the Pharmacy had improved Cllr Davies agreed adding that the monthly system seemed to be working well.

Cllr Davies complemented Cllrs Payne and Barnes for their long service and the sterling job they had done on behalf of the Parish – all joined in a round of applause.

The Chairman thanked Cllr Davies and added that Cllr Barnes had worked hard for the Parish for 47 years particularly on behalf of Murrow village and the Parish was indebted to him.

Cllr Allen asked for Guyhirn Football Club lease to be added to the agenda for May 2015. In order to draw down funding they need to demonstrate that they have a link term lease in place. (Believed to expire 2022).
