Apologies were received from Cllr. D Broker.

# **CHAIRMANS ADDRESS.**

The Meeting was adjourned for the duration of the Chairman's address.

On behalf of the Parish Council the Chairman described the period when all were shocked and needed help and advice following the sad death of Parish Clerk Carolyn Jobson, an emergency meeting was convened. Yvonne Reader offered help which was very gratefully received during a challenging period, particularly during the Audit period. This required sorting all paper and e-files to abstract the necessary data to keep the Parish Council business going effectively. Yvonne's support was very much appreciated by the Parish Council and particularly by the Chairman. The Chairman also thanked Parson Drove Parish Council for their support during this difficult period. Yvonne was thanked for all her support and advice and also for her ongoing support which was very much appreciated by all. The Chairman presented Yvonne with a bouquet of flowers.

The Chairman welcomed Geoff Wilkinson to his first meeting as Clerk and Responsible Financial Officer.

Cllr Jennings explained that the presentation said that no reductions in bus services were planned, though Cllr Jennings found it hard to see how efficiencies could be achieved otherwise. The objective was a £2m reduction in costs. He commented that this was clearly at an early stage and they were seeking views. Further meetings were planned and he and Cllr Reay will continue to attend.

#### 7. HIGHWAYS MATTERS

Highways and streetlight reports from Councillors on problems causing immediate concerns.

(a) Highways

Clir Fish will attend a meeting on October 8<sup>th</sup> 2014 at Thorney Toll Village Hall regarding the speed limit.

Gull Road is in poor condition.

Cllr Jennings had met Amanda Hill (CCC) at High Road, Guyhirn. There are potholes and the surface is breaking up to the extent that it is beyond patching.

The footway from Selwyn Corner to Black Drove is breaking up and collapsing into gardens.

Cllr Fowler reported a hedge overgrown and suggested a letter from the Parish Council to the owner could help and should be considered.

High Road, Guyhirn o/s Fir Trees the footway is in poor condition and requires resurfacing.

The roundabout at A47 Rings End was very badly over grown with weeds.

The road signs at Pigeons Corner had been damaged and not yet repaired or replaced.

Seadyke Road to Bellamy Bridge has dangerous potholes and some subsidence.

Cllr Knight reported that although defects o/s the Post Office had been marked for repair with paint there had been no action after 5 months.

Dangerous hole in the kerb/footway o/s Fish Shop Wisbech St. Mary.

Gull Road, Murrow Bank carriageway depressions.

High Road, Guyhirn three properties along from Chapelfield Road surface water lays on the road surface due to poor falls and drainage.

(b) Streetlights.

No issues reported.

(c) To discuss the increasing concern about accidents at the Bellamy's Bridge junction.

CCC has advised that a joint application was not permissible contrary to previous understanding. After discussing the matter in detail it was agreed that Councillors Payne and Booth would meet to discuss the issue further.

# **8. FINANCE MATTERS**

(a) HMRC have confirmed that the Parish Council is due a refund of £192.26 due to overpayment of NI. Noted.

(b) Street Lighting Concurrent Functions Grant.

A clear proposal has yet to emerge. Fenland District Council are further considering the issue.

The Clerk was requested to prepare a schedule of previous awards so that it was available to Councillors for reference when considering new applications.

(i) Murrow Playing Field Association Improvements to Changing Facilities.

Adequate financial information including accurate costs and details of any grant awards are required to enable the Parish Council to make an informed decision.

(j) Murrow Playing Field Association Replacement Basket Seat.

It was agreed to fund the cost of supply and delivery of the seat as quoted by Fenland Leisure providing that the invoice is addressed and sent to the Parish Council in order that VAT can be claimed back.

(k) Provision for payment to Mrs Y Reader for Parish Clerks duties and advice.

Councillors considered an invoice in the sum of £2400.85 in respect of Clerks duties and advice until a new Clerk could be appointed. **Agreed** 

#### 9. PARISH PROPERTY

- (a) The Chairman advised that he had received invoices for work carried out to Tholomas Drove and Wisbech St Mary bus shelters and that these would be on the Agenda for the next meeting. S Bowles had also completed an additional £750 of maintenance work. The Chairman reminded him of the importance of quarterly invoicing.
- (b) Parish Council Notice Boards. The Chairman described the very poor condition they were in such that they create a bad impression. Cllr Britain agreed to undertake a project to review their condition, style, design and location. I was noted that where a large door was difficult to manage in a high wind consideration should be given to two doors. Each should bear the name Wisbech St Mary Parish Council.
- (c) Cllr Knight requested that the seat by the pond in Wisbech St Mary should be refurbished as it was in very poor condition. Cllr Britain agreed to consider this as well.
- (d) The grass needs cutting around the pond.
- (e) S Bowles will be requested to improve the appearance of the Notice Boards by tidying around their bases.

# 10. REPORTS FROM DISTRICT AND COUNTY COUNCILLORS

Councillor Booth advised: (a) that there was to be a meeting Thursday to consider Hudson Centre signage. The proposals had the approval of the Hudson Trust.

- (b) Planning Department were exploring the option of using CNC as was the case at Kings Lynn and West Norfolk District Council.
- (c) Officers are exploring whether it would be cost effective to occupy Hereward Hall, March.

Councillor Gillick advised: A seminar held by the Community Infrastructure Committee identified the need to rationalise assets and generate receipts and revenues. The objective was to save £37m. Examples of items being considered were to reduce the number of recycling centres (the requirement was for only one in the County, dimming street lights, significantly reducing grass cutting and handing over the trimming of Rights of Way to others. Given that the continued drive was to reduce costs it was simply impracticable to expect to receive all the improvements that were desired.

## 11. POLICE MATTERS

PC Russ could not be present but had supplied crime and incident report and notes from the Wisbech North Rural Forum 21 August 2014. Noted.

#### **12. ANY OTHER BUSINESS** (for information only)

The Chairman thanked those who had attended the training session on 8 September and commented how useful he thought it had been as much had changed from earlier advice. He encouraged all to attend the next sessions on 6 October and 27 October. The Clerk was requested to explore if training for Chairmen/Vice Chairmen was available and if extra copies of the training material for those who were unable to attend was available.
