Minutes of the Meeting of Wisbech St Mary Parish Council held on Monday August 5th, 2019 at Thorney Toll Village Hall.

Item 2 was taken first so guests were not unduly delayed.

2. DEREK BURGOYNE, BIOCOW ENVIRONMENTAL

The Chairman welcomed two representatives of Biocow. Derek Burgoyne (DB) gave a presentation of the background, objectives and process involved and then took questions. The objective is to produce green energy. Food waste feeds cattle, cattle waste goes to the anaerobic digestion plant, liquid waste is spread on the land which boosts the crop. No waste is brought to site. Gas can be brought I from other sites. Renewable energy is fed into the national transit grid. The trial is supported by OFGEM and National Grid. Injection of biomethane into the national grid will commence in one month. In response to questions DB said there could be 12 extra tanker movements over a 24 hour period 7 days per week to bring in gas, in addition to existing movements. A second lagoon was being constructed – this was simply to ensure the first did not fill to capacity which could halt production. DB explained that they wish to work with the local community and funds were available to contribute to highway improvements.

The Chairman thanked Derek Burgoyne and his colleague for attending.

7. CORRESPONDENCE RECEIVED

The clerk read an email from CCC about Tackling Scams inviting the Council to sign up to the 'Against Scams Partnership'. Following discussion details were noted, it was decided not to join at this stage.

8. HIGHWAYS MATTERS

(a) Street Lighting

Electrical Testing Ltd have said that upgrading streetlights on the arterial routes would be completed by end September2019.

Street Lighting Energy. The Clerk summarised the situation: FDC have said that the Parish Council must have arrangements in place for paying energy costs direct by 1 August 2019, arrangements with UK Power Networks have been completed, arrangements with EON are nearing completion. The quotation from EON is £8,595 per year, i.e. £57.30 per light per year. They have said the Council is not obligated to accept this quotation and can seek quotes from alternative suppliers. CCC have contacted all Town and Parish Councils announcing that they will no longer buy energy their behalf and the recharge them at the end of every year. Wisbech St Mary Parish Council have never paid for energy, FDC have paid for energy. It is the view of the Council that they should continue to do so. The Council has been contacted by Utility Aid, an energy broker, asking if the Council wishes them to procure energy on the Councils behalf (they currently have twenty-five clients, a number which is likely to increase). The question of energy payments is to be considered by FDC Cabinet in September. Some of the other parishes within FDC were awaiting the outcome of Cabinet before

deciding on action. It was suggested the Council should follow suit; the Clerk would advise those concerned. **Agreed unanimously.**

(b) Highways

CCC Cllr King reported the outcome of a site meeting to review the Bellamy Bridge Project: the design had been amended, resurfacing would take place September/October which would improve the effectiveness of the red centre line. Signage is the best achievable. He suggested a bid for a major improvement should be added to the Transport Infrastructure Plan. Cllr agreed to the chairman's request to monitor progress.

The Chairman agreed to Cllr King making his report early as he has another commitment to attend to. CCC Cllr King reported:

- i. 'Speed Cameras' were only installed in Cambridgeshire if justified by killed and/or seriously injured accident data.
- ii. Tholomas Drove trees Cllr King agreed to attend the meeting with Cllr Britain.
- iii.A meeting was planned for Thursday how to address potholes.
- iv.Innovate to Cultivate a new round of bidding had commenced
